

Call for Nominations for the Academy of Management Public and Nonprofit Division 2023 Keith G. Provan Award

The Public and Nonprofit (PNP) Division of the Academy of Management is inviting nominations for the 2023 Keith G. Provan Award. The Keith G. Provan Award was established in 2015 by the members of the PNP Division to posthumously honor the legacy of excellence that Keith brought to the field. Throughout his career, Keith contributed high-level theory that innovated existing fields and broke open emergent fields in management and public administration. The hallmark of Keith's work was undoubtedly his contribution to theory-building through empirical investigation. His methods were varied and suited the question at hand, but his work always spoke to theory. Additionally, Keith reached into the best available literature to inform his work, not limiting himself to his trained discipline (management) or his adopted one (public administration) but rather finding insight from an eclectic set of literature and bringing the best knowledge to bear onto his problem of interest.

The recipient of the award should embody these ideals and contributions. The recipient should be **a distinguished contributor** to the field of Public Administration and their work should be:

1. interdisciplinary in integrating literature from across perspectives,
2. contribute substantially to both theory and empirical approaches, and
3. make a unique and identifiable contribution to knowledge in public administration research.

Nominations will be accepted until **Tuesday, April 18, 2023**. Nominations should include a copy of the nominated individual's vita and a statement from the nominator. Self-nominations will not be accepted. Nominations will be reviewed by the award committee which consists of Russell S. Hassan (Ohio State), Robin H. Lemaire (LSU), Jaclyn S. Piatak (UNC Charlotte), Chris E. Silvia (BYU), and Bradley E. Wright (Georgia). The committee will review the nominated individual's work to assess their contribution to theory, empiricism, interdisciplinarity, the impact of work, and stature in the field. The award will be given at the Business meeting of the PNP Division at the 2023 Annual Meeting of the Academy of Management in Boston.
